


THE WORD

FIRST LESSON Zechariah 9:9, 10

Who is this Jesus who comes thus into Holy Week? He is the fulfillment of all of God's promises in the Old Testament. It is time in Holy Week to watch his procession through this most sacred week with growing wonder and awe and adoration! It's all for sinners! That means, it's all for you!

Rejoice greatly, Daughter of Zion! Shout, Daughter of Jerusalem! Look! Your King is coming to you. He is righteous and brings salvation. He is humble and is riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. ¹⁰ I will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the horse from Jerusalem. The battle bow will be taken away, and he will proclaim peace to the nations. His kingdom will extend from sea to sea, from the River to the ends of the earth.

SECOND LESSON Philippians 2:5-11

As he rides his donkey into Holy Week we hear his name and kneel; we hear his name and confess: Jesus is Lord, he alone and none other.

⁵ Indeed, let this attitude be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus. ⁶Though he was by nature God, he did not consider equality with God as a prize to be displayed, ⁷ but he emptied himself by taking the nature of a servant. When he was born in human likeness, and his appearance was like that of any other man, ⁸ he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death– even death on a cross. ⁹Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.



NICENE CREED


We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.



Use us Lord, to help others as we reflect your love to the world.




M: O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good.



PERSONAL PREPARATION FOR HOLY COMMUNION

- Q: What does God tell me about myself in his holy Word?
- A: He says that I am a sinner and deserve only his punishment.
- Q: What should I do if I am not aware of my sins or am not troubled by them?
- A: I should examine myself according to the Ten Commandments and ask how well I have carried out my responsibilities as a husband or wife or single person, as a parent or child, an employer or employee, a teacher or student. Have I loved God with all my heart, gladly heard his Word, and patiently endured affliction? Have I been disobedient, proud, or unforgiving? Have I been selfish, lazy, envious, or quarrel some? Have I lied or deceived, taken something not mine, or given anyone a bad name? Have I abused my body or permitted indecent thoughts to linger in my mind? Have I failed to do what is right and good?
- Q: When I realize that I have sinned against God and deserve his punishment, what should I do?
- A: I will confess before God all my sins, those which I remember as well as those of which I am unaware. I will pray to God for his mercy and forgiveness.
- Q: How do I receive his gracious forgiveness?
- A: His Word assures me that Jesus led a pure and holy life for me and died on the cross for me to pay the full price for all my sins. Through faith in Jesus, I have been clothed in my Savior's perfect righteousness and holiness.
- Q: What further assurance do I have that Jesus is mine and I am his?
- A: In Holy Communion he gives me his body and blood together with the bread and wine as a truly life-giving food and drink to unite me with him and my fellow believers. By means of this sacrament, Jesus not only forgives my sins but sweeps away all my doubts about his love for me, gives me his own strength to live a God-pleasing life, and grants me a joyful foretaste of heaven.
- Q: How can I be sure that I receive all these blessings in the Lord's Supper?

- A: I have his own word spoken as his last will and testament on the night before he died. There he tells me: "Take and eat; this is my body. Drink from it, all of you; this is my blood which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me."
- Q: How will I respond to this priceless gift from Jesus?
- A: I will daily thank and praise him for his love to me. With his help I will fight temptation, do my best to correct whatever wrongs I have done, and serve him and those around me with love and good works.

Lord Jesus, with joy and gratitude I now come to your table to receive the precious food of your life-giving body and blood. May it strengthen me to remain in you as you remain in me, so that I bear much fruit in devoted service to you and in acts of kindness to others. Amen.

Personal Prayers

Before Communion

Lord, I am not worthy to be a guest at your holy table. But you are the friend of sinners, and you will not cast me out. This bread is your body, which bore my sins upon the tree. This wine is your blood, which purifies me from all guilt. At your invitation, I come rejoicing. Receive me, my Savior.

After Communion

Thank you, Lord Jesus Christ, for nourishing me in this sacrament with your body and blood. You have given me forgiveness, life, and salvation. Let me always remain in you as a branch remains in the vine. Send me out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. O living Bread from heaven, how richly you have fed your guest! The gifts you now have given have filled my heart with joy and rest. Lord, grant me that thus strengthened with heavenly food, while here my course on earth is lengthened, I serve with holy fear. And when you call my spirit to leave this world below, I enter through your merit where joys unmingled flow.



Jesus Humbly Rides Into Jerusalem to Die

God's Word for Today Our Lord is so different from earthly rulers. The first Palm Sunday Jesus was coming to finish history's most crucial battle, yet he did not enter Jerusalem as a mighty warrior. He had no army. Jesus came on a lowly donkey, with twelve average men following him. Crowds greeted him with words from Psalm 118–words that rang to the heavens then, words still lifted to Jesus today: "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!"

First Lesson (Zechariah 9:9-10)

- 1. Zechariah writes 520 years before Christ. What does Zechariah say Jesus will bring for all people? (See 9:9.)
- 2. Look at 9:10. What amazing gift would this King riding on a donkey bring?
- 3. How does Zechariah give us a picture of the salvation our King would bring in verse 10?

Epistle (Philippians 2:1-10)

- 4. As followers of Jesus what kind of attitude are we to have?
- 5. Why is it such a surprising thing that Jesus humbled himself all the way to the most cursed death, that of a cross?
- 6. Because Jesus was willing to endure so much for us, what glory did God, the Father, give him?

Gospel (Mark 11:1-10)

- 7. If Jesus knows details about the colt, etc., ahead of time, what else must he know in advance?
- 8. What does the word *hosanna* mean?

Answers:

- 1. Zechariah says Jesus will come into Jerusalem with salvationeternal life-for all people.
- 2. Zechariah says the King will bring peace to the nations.
- 3. What a picture: There would be no more instruments of war. In Zechariah's day the instruments of war were chariots, warhorses and bows. Today we would say that there would be no more guns, missiles, tanks, bombers, or fighters. Instead there would be peace throughout the earth and the King (Jesus) would rule over all. This picture finds its fulfillment in heaven, and on the new earth, where sin and war will rage no more for God's people.
- 4. We are to have the same attitude as Christ Jesus, who humbled himself in service to serve his Father and others.
- 5. If we had been in a position of authority over all things, we wouldn't want to give it up to serve others, let alone die under God's curse on the cross. Jesus left the glory of heaven to live in a world filled with sin, violence and death. What great love for sinners!
- 6. The Father gave the Son back the full use of the position the Son had always had, from eternity: equality with the Father in every way. Now when we worship Jesus as Lord, God the Father receives the glory he deserves. Let us do this now and forever!
- 7. If Jesus knew about the colt, etc., Jesus must have known all that would happen in his betrayal, suffering and crucifixion. What love for us and for the Father he had!
- 8. *Hosanna* literally meant, "Please, save." It was a plea for deliverance. Because we generally only call for rescue to people great enough to help, over the centuries *hosanna* became a shout of exclamation or praise to someone great.

- That Christ will return visibly to judge all people;
- That all who do not believe in Christ will not be saved but will suffer in hell for eternity;
- That all who believe in Jesus Christ will be saved and go to heaven.
