



#### Same Old...

Have you ever said that, or felt that way? Sigh. "Same old..." Another boring year. Same dead-end job. Health hasn't improved. Bills keep coming. Same troublesome neighbors. More out-of-control government. More cold and more snow. Ugh...it's just the same old thing, one year after another.

We can start to sound a little like Eeyore, the pathetic little donkey friend of Winnie the Pooh. "Don't bother being happy on my account. Same dreary life." When we are experiencing a monotonous routine, we may find ourselves growing weary and disgusted with the 'broken record' patterns of life.

There is something that doesn't change from year to year (although I wish that it would). We are the same old sinners. We commit the same old sins. We're often discontented. We complain too much. We take credit when it is not due to us. We are easily angered. We are frequently disappointed, especially when things don't go our way. We are selfish and rude. We are greedy and impatient. Same old us. Same old sinners. Still deserving God's punishment for our sin and guilt.

It would be great if our daily love affair with sin would end. But there is one routine that is good. I challenge you to see that much of the pattern we see in life is a blessing from God. Consider the reading of Genesis 8:22 (NIV '84) "As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease."

There is a level of comfort and familiarity with a recognizable pattern. God's blessings surround us from day-to-day and year-to-year. He promises it. The seasons and weather patterns come with a certain amount of variation, but they are always here. The Lord provides us with seedtime and harvest. He feeds and provides for all His creatures this way. There is day and night, every single day of our existence. Our Lord is a God of wisdom and order. That remains unchangeable from day-to-day and year-to-year. Some might sigh in disappointment and say, "Same old..."

Do we? Are we no longer thrilled at the beauty of the seasons? Have we lost all interest in the mind-blowing variety of foods the Lord provides? Have the Lord and His patterns in our lives and in our world been denigrated to a 'ho hum' status in our heads and hearts? Has the message of God's love for us through Jesus and His cross become something we take for granted? Is the daily reminder of our salvation and eternal life in Christ barely raising our eyebrows?

God's pattern of loving and providing for us is the same old routine we have seen since we first met Him in the Scriptures. And that is terrific! We woke up this morning to enjoy another day of His grace! Today is a new day to feast on a variety of blessings which our gracious Lord pours out on us. We have a home, heat, clothing, food, life, breath, and many other physical gifts. And don't forget the greater gifts of God's neverfailing presence, the forgiveness of our sins, new life in Christ, His promise to use all things (even those difficult things in life that don't seem like blessings) for our good, and the assurance of endless life with Him in heaven through faith in Jesus.

In this month's newsletter we examine the statistics of our annual report and thank our gracious Lord for another year of blessings. There are things that might lead us to say, "Same old..." But again, I challenge you to see how the Lord has blessed us in 2015 and gives us the confidence to serve Him boldly in 2016. Same old? Perhaps. But I like to think about it this way: the Lord gives us the same wonderful blessings year after year. We have His Word and His sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, and the structure of the liturgy in weekly worship. We have a family of Christians to serve and by whom we are served. We have seasons, planting and harvest, life and breath – all that we need. Praise the Lord! He continues to be our same old, reliable, faithful, loving, gracious, and generous God. Enjoy His blessings in this new year!

# A Short Story



### **Jesus is the Suffering Savior**

He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering.... He was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities, the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed.

Isaiah 53:3,5

#### God's Words of Love

Valentine's Day cards contain words that are chosen very carefully. They are meaningful words of love and affection. Sometimes when we are sending a valentine to someone, we might even agonize over which words to use. We want to choose the right words that express the deep love we have.

How about the words printed above by the prophet Isaiah? Would you include any of his words in a card to your loved one? At first thought you would say, "Absolutely not!" Words like "despised... rejected... sorrows... suffering... punishment" would be the last choice for a Valentine's Day card! But the Bible surprises us. These words from God are really a wonderful expression of his true love for people.

The first thing to understand is that Isaiah was writing about Jesus. Jesus, God's Son, was sent to earth to be the world's Savior. The Bible tells us that because of sin there was punishment looming for all people. But Jesus took that punishment on himself. Jesus is our Savior who suffered for sinners. He took all this suffering on himself, including death on a cross, so that people wouldn't suffer eternally.

The second thing to remember is that we are talking about something very personal to all of us. We were the ones Jesus came to suffer for. We were the ones who were headed to the punishment of eternal separation from God. Our sinful thoughts, words, and actions condemned us. But as the prophet wrote, "He was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities, the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed."

Jesus' love for us is deep and long-lasting. It's not a shallow love that we might receive from others, or a love that is here today and gone tomorrow. Jesus' love is eternal. He promises that since he suffered and gave up his life for us, he will continue to love us each and every day.

Every time you open the Bible it's like Valentine's Day. These are God's words of love for you.

### Bringing Church to Those Who Cannot Come

By Randy Johnson, pastor at Our Savior, Perry, Mich. Let me tell you about a group of Christians who face real obstacles to getting to church. They sound like these: "I really cannot get out of bed." "I can't get into my wheelchair without help." "My walker is out of reach." Or simply, "I forgot." These are not feeble excuses. They are genuine obstacles. These are Christians who would gladly and eagerly be in church on Sunday, if only they could. These are the things I hear when I go to one of two elder care facilities in my area to conduct worship. In the Michigan District of WELS, there are nearly 25 pastors leading services for seniors in residential care facilities.

These aged Christians may not be able to get to the chapel or common area without help. They may not remember what day it is. They may be feeling ill. They may have hurting feet and arthritic joints. But they want to worship. They desire to hear God's Word and be assured that their sins are forgiven. They long for encouragement to live another day. They hunger for a little snapshot of heaven to help them look forward to the joys that await them when the Lord finally calls them to his side. That is what we provide when we bring church to our elderly and aged. They may not know what day it is, or sometimes not even remember where they are, but when they gather to sing familiar hymns, recite the Apostles' Creed, and say the Lord's Prayer, they do so with tears of joy, smiling faces, and thankful hearts. They hear that even in their old age, they are still "Jesus' little lambs."

Serving the spiritual needs of our elderly is not only rewarding but necessary. As the population of our aged Christian brothers and sisters grows, so do our opportunities to minister to them.

"He satisfies my desires with good things, so that my youth is renewed like the eagle's" (Psalm 103:5).







Our Tuesday morning study meets in the "chapel room" at 9 am. Thursday morning class meets at the Lakeshore Restaurant from 9-10:30 am. Men and women of all ages and Bible knowledge are welcome.

#### **Confirmation**

Level 1 Confirmation is a brief study of the Old & New Testaments. The course, "From Promise to Glory," uses an interactive DVD to make learning visual, stimulating, and fun. The class is an overview of the Bible's history, walking the students through God's promise of salvation in the Garden of Eden, to the glorious home in heaven for which we are preparing. Level 1 is for first year Confirmation students. Level 2 Confirmation is our "traditional catechism class." Designed to be more in-depth, this class takes the students deeper into the doctrines, or teachings, of God's Word. We study the chief parts of the Bible as outlined in Luther's Catechism. Level 2 is for 2nd and 3rd year students and meets on Sundays at 10:15 am.

#### **Sunday School**

Sunday School is where you'll find the younger sect of our congregation. We offer classes for all children, 2 years old through 6th grade on Sunday mornings, September– May, at 10:15 am. 7 & 8 grade students are either in Confirmation or are invited to assist with the Sunday School program.
