

From our Pastor

"Tricked ... or Treat?"

It won't be long until the streets of town - and your porch - are raided by little urchins, chorusing their selfish plea for sweet hand-outs. They visit you incognito, hiding their faces under innocent-looking costumes of pumpkins and princesses. Some of them will come to your door dressed to kill, masked as pirates and witches, ghouls and goblins, and other tortured souls. Their request was traditionally veiled under the threat: "You will be tricked if you don't give me a treat."

A number of years ago a truly tortured soul fell prey to the greatest of tricks. Although he lived in a monastery and dedicated his life to the study of religion, he was racked by grief and haunted by the devil's most effective temptation: doubt. "Will God REALLY forgive all of your sins? What good can you do to balance out all the bad things you have done in your life? How can you gain the attention of the Most High in order to secure your place in eternal peace?"

It was not until Martin Luther was allowed to study the Bible that he was relieved of the destructive half-truths and bold-faced lies of the church in his day, and freed from the guilt and shame that ravaged his troubled soul. No matter how hard sinners try, it is impossible to earn heaven. No amount of money can buy God's love. Jesus - and Jesus alone - provides the path to peace, as He Himself says in John 14:6, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me["] (NIV).

Luther would be tricked no longer once he came to know and believe the Gospel message. What a treat to learn of Christ's forgiveness! "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:1 - NIV). What a treat to know that salvation was purchased by the blood of Christ for everyone, as John 3:16 dearly proclaims: "God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not *perish but have eternal life*" (NIV). What a treat to have the Bible, the building materials for an unshakable faith! Jesus says, "Everyone who hears these words of Mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock" (Matthew 7:24-25 - NIV).

While the world is busy stock-piling their soul-decaying sweets and the devil is frantically brain-storming his latest schemes, we can rejoice in the truth which brought everlasting comfort to the Reformer: "God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trou*ble*" (Psalm 46:1 - NIV).

Resting in the words and promises of the living God, we will not be tricked. Instead, feasting on the Gospel's life-giving message in Christ Jesus, we are treated to the richest of fare: forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Thank God for such heavenly treats!

"One more book, Dad! Please!" my two-year-old daughter tells me as she looks at me with her baby blue eyes and holds up her favorite book. These books contain short stories that hold the attention of the listener (and the reader) while providing some entertainment or education along the way.

We read for many reasons. And we know that most of the things we read whether online, in the newspaper, or in a book must be read with a discerning eye. The problem is that we sometimes struggle to know which parts of them are real and true.


This can be a challenge. But what about when it comes to the Bible, the Holy Bible? Well, that is another story! Why? Throughout Scripture we are told that God's Word is different. What makes it different? The author is God. Yes, men wrote the Bible but God is the main author. It is His holy, perfect Word.

God tells us some remarkable truths about his Word such as: God's Word cannot be broken (everything it says is reliable). His Word is truth (why would God lie to us?). His Word is sharp (it can pierce through the hardest of hearts). His Word is alive (it is active). His Word is powerful. His Word always achieves God's purpose. His Word will never pass away.

While these truths are important to note, it is the message of God's Word that can't be overlooked. For God says that the purpose of the Bible, the Holy Bible, is for us to know that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing we may have life in His name.

The Bible is holy. But you have to open and use it to get anything out of it. If you want to change a heart or be comforted by God's grace, you have to "blow off the dust" and share or listen to the holy words of our God. These are the words that He authored through men, for you, to tell you about His great love and saving activity in Jesus, so that through the encouragement of the Scriptures you might have hope.

Recipe Corner Tomato Minestone Soup with Garlic Croutons

Looking for an easy, comforting meal? Try this soup! Need meat? Add a few mini-meatballs when you add the stock. Perfect for a night in.

Ingredients

2 T olive oil 1# zucchini, seeded and diced 2 ribs celery, finely chopped 1 small carrot, finely chopped onion, finely chopped ı bay leaf 3 cloves garlic, finely chopped Salt & Pepper to taste 4 cups chicken or veggie stock 1 150z cannellini beans 1 15 oz can crushed tomatoes 1/4# whole wheat penne (or any other short-cut pasta) Handful of fresh basil, torn into pieces 2 T butter 4 thick slices of Italian bread 1/2 cup parmesan, grated Finely chopped parsely, for garnish

Directions

1. In a soup pot, heat the oil over medium-high heat. Add the zucchini, celery, carrot, onion, bay leaf and 2 cloves garlic; season with salt and pepper. Cook until the vegetables are tender, 7 to 8 minutes.

2. Heat the broiler and position a rack in the middle of the oven. Stir the chicken stock, beans and tomatoes into the soup and bring to a boil. Add the pasta and cook until al dente. Stir in the basil and lower the heat to low.

3. Meanwhile, in a small saucepan, melt the butter over low heat. Add in the remaining 1 clove garlic and swirl for a minute or so; remove from the heat.

4. Broil the bread on both sides until lightly toasted. Brush the bread with the garlic butter and sprinkle with the cheese and parsley. Broil to melt the cheese. Serve the soup topped with a crouton.
