

From our Pastor

'Dying to Live' or 'Living to Die'?

We humans are so impatient. It's almost as if we're dying to get to the next phase in life, without enjoying the here and now.



The two year old wants to be in preschool. The child in preschool wants to be in Kindergartener wants to be in grade school. The first grader wants to be in second, the second grader wants to be in third, and so on. The eighth grader can't wait to be in high school. The high school student impatiently yearns for a career or college.

Young adults want to find that special someone to marry and with whom to raise a family. The expectant parents can't wait to meet the baby growing in its mother's womb. Parents of a newborn are dying for their child to grow up, to speak and to walk. The employee dreams of retirement. And so it goes. It seems that we human beings are not content to enjoy the blessings of the day. We are always looking forward to what's next, without appreciating what we have right now.

Are we dying to live? Or are we living to die?

Soon we will be celebrating Ascension, the day our Savior visibly left His disciples and returned to His throne in heaven. We cannot help but remember the work Jesus came to do and completed while here on earth.

Jesus was born as a baby in Bethlehem to die as a 33 year old man on the cross of Calvary. God's Son stepped into our world – living to die – for us and for all sinners. He followed His Father's commandments to the 'T', never once stepping over the line. He is the image of perfection, loving all people by pointing out their sin and calling them to repentance, and offering Himself as the ransom price for a world full of hell-bound rebels. Jesus came, not to condemn the world, but to rescue all humanity through His perfect life, freely given in sacrifice.

But as our Lord was living to die, He was dying to live. Jesus willingly allowed Himself to be cruelly mistreated and put to death. Our Lord, of His own accord, gave up His life on the altar of the cross, fully aware that in three days He would live again. He died to rescue us from our sins. He lives to take us to heaven! And that is what our living Lord is working on today. He is preparing a home of eternal peace for all who rely on Him as their Savior from sin and hell.

Let's pause for a moment to see and enjoy the gifts the Lord has given us today. Are we discontented with the place or blessings or challenges the Lord has given us? Are we so eager to get on with life that we're actually forgetting to live today in God's grace, serving Him and loving one another right now? I pray that our gracious God forgives our impatience and fills us with contentment to live as His children. I pray that He gives us a greater appreciation for today's lot in life.




Consider the passage from Philippians 1:21 – For to me to live is Christ and to die is gain.

Are we who trust in Jesus to forgive our sins and to safely carry us to heaven – living to die or dying to live? In a manner of speaking, we're doing both. We live in God's grace, eager to love Him who loved us first, anticipating the end of this earthly life. As these fragile bodies die a little bit each day, we confidently look forward to the eternal life our Savior is preparing for us in heaven.

While we live, live for Christ. When we die, die in Christ. As children of our heavenly Father through faith in His dear Son, you might say that we are living to live! Live on, dear Christian! Live for Jesus now until we get to live with Him in heaven.

Jesus is the Ascended Savior

Jesus was taken up into heaven. Luke 24:51

Mary, the mother of Jesus, received the angel's announcement that her son would be the Son of God and the King of God's people (Luke 1: 32). What amazement must have filled her heart! Yet Simeon's prophecy would also come true, that a sword would pierce Mary's heart. What agony must have filled her spirit as she gazed on her son being tortured to death! But then came His glorious resurrection, proving that He is the eternal Son of God and that He fully accomplished His heavenly Father's plan of salvation for the world.

The risen Lord Jesus appeared to many people proving that He was alive. Forty days after His resurrection, Jesus returned to heaven. His ascension is celebrated in the Christian church on the fortieth day after Easter. This year Ascension Day falls on May 5th.

While churches may or may not have a special worship service on the actual day that Jesus' ascension is observed every year, Christians always glorify our living, ascended Savior. We lift up our voices in praise of Jesus who was lifted up to the highest honor of heaven. Our hearts are filled with the excitement of Jesus' ascension as the Bible relates in Philippians 2:9-11:

God exalted [Christ Jesus] to the highest place and gave Him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Having fully accomplished the work of salvation, Jesus returned to heaven and now reigns in the highest position of all authority. And He proclaimed, "I will come back" (John 14:3). Eventually, everyone will know the truth that Jesus is the eternal Son of God who came to be the world's Savior. He return will be the most fearful time for those who rejected Jesus in unbelief. They will be sent away to eternal punishment in hell.

The Lord Jesus, however, wants people to have life with Him forever in heaven. So before He ascended into heaven, He commanded that the good news of the salvation He won by His death and resurrection be proclaimed to everyone.

That good news is for you too! **Jesus is your Savior.** One day, perhaps soon, He will return from heaven. How will you meet Him? By trusting in Jesus who rescued you from eternal death, you can join the people who will be rejoicing to see Jesus in all of His glory. At His return, He will take all believers to the place He prepared for them in heaven. What an awesome ascension day that will be!

Nancy's Quick & Easy Casserole

Serves 8.

Ingredients:

1# Ground beef

24 oz frozen hash browns

1 can cream of mushroom soup

1 cup sour cream

2 cups sharp cheddar cheese, shredded

1 medium onion, chopped

6 oz can French's Fried Onions

Directions:

Preheat oven to 350.

In a large skillet, cook beef until brown, stirring to complete browning. Drain and pour beef into a large bowl.

Add potatoes, soup, sour cream, cheese and onion. Mix well.

Spread into a 9 X 13 baking dish.

Bake for 30-45 minutes, or until bubbly.

Top with fried onions and bake until onions are brown, about 5 minutes.

Salt and pepper to taste.


