## **Twenty Years of Fishing**



**Fishing has** always been part of my life.



It is all about God's Word– Law and Gospel.



"Come, follow Me and I will make you fishers of m<u>en."</u>

Fishing has always been a part of my life. Not that it's always been enjoyable. Like the time a fish hook had to be extracted from one of my brother's posterior. Or trying to force a squishy, wiggly, squiggly worm onto the hook and wanting someone else to do it. Or snapping off the end of my fishing pole. Or the frustrating times when a favorite lure was left dangling from a tree on the opposite bank of the river.

But there certainly are some positive memories when it comes to my days of fishing. When dad came home from salmon fishing with that really big one (the picture still hangs on their wall back home). That time when we ran out of bait and the fish were biting on little pieces of plastic bags! Or slowly retrieving an artificial worm and watching that big large mouth take my bait. And this summer, all the little fishing trips with the family, improving my filleting skills, and the tasty fish fries we have enjoyed together.

You know how old I am – I have actually been fishing for more than twenty years. But you also know that I have been called by the Lord into the public Gospel ministry for twenty years, this summer. I am reminded of Jesus' words to some fishing friends He knew:

As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, He saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "Come, follow Me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed Him. - Matthew 4:18-20 (NIV1984)

The Lord called me away from the trout streams and the fish ponds to a different kind of fishing. Only it doesn't involve poles, worms, and lures. It is all about God's Word – Law and Gospel – and sharing that message with sinners like myself.

After what ended up to be 9 years of study, in May of 1997 I was assigned to a dual parish between Iron Mountain and Escanaba, Michigan. St. Paul's in Hyde and Grace in Powers were the first "ponds" I "fished" as a fisher of men. After about 4 years I accepted the call to Christ in Beatrice, Nebraska, and served as God's fisher of souls there for 7 years. In October of 2008 I began fishing in the Wautoma area.

Looking back, I count twenty years of fishing. Twenty years of studying God's Word, that powerful message of sin and grace. Applying the Law to sinful hearts, leading this fisherman and many others to repentance, crushing the selfish and disobedient man inside. And applying the Gospel to repentant sinners, refreshing and comforting God's faithful children with His message of peace, love and forgiveness in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. Casting out the good news of salvation and eternal life, apart from our own merit, purely on the basis of our perfect Savior. Leading fellow sinners to Jesus. Fishing for eternal souls to rescue them for eternal life.

Fishing for men is often a messy procedure. A pastor learns all kinds of things about the "fish" he "catches" and serves. How often we fight and squirm against the hook of God's Law which convicts our sinful hearts. What a relief that our loving Lord releases us from the condemnation our sins deserve - we're "off the hook" if you will - rescued by our selfless Savior to enjoy a new life in His kingdom, here on earth and forever in heaven.

We all have been "caught" by the Gospel, so we fish. Throwing out the nets. Living our Christian faith. Sharing the Gospel of peace in Christ with a world that is in turmoil. Guiding souls to Jesus and the eternal life He offers. Called by Jesus, as pastor or as lay-worker, fishing for men.

# **A Short Story**



The Struggle Against Sin I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do-this I keep on doing. ... What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God—through Jesus Christ our Lord! - Romans 7:18-19, 24-25

"I wanted to be done with that bad habit, but there I went and did it again." Does it surprise you that even when you are a Christian, and have a heart that wants to follow God, you still struggle against sinful impulses, and too often fall to them?

You are not the first Christian to feel that way. Almost 2000 years ago the apostle Paul wrote: "I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do-this I keep on doing." Right before that verse, he explained why this was so. He wrote, "I know that nothing good lives in me, that is, in my sinful nature."

When God brings people to faith in Christ, He covers them with Christ's forgiveness and counts them as completely holy. He creates in them a new heart that loves the Lord and wants to walk in His ways. But as long as we are in this life, the old, sinful self that we have from birth still wants to do what is evil and fights against the good desires of the new heart God created within us.

So Christians still struggle against sin every day. They often stumble and do sinful things their new hearts don't want to do. And it frustrates them! Paul wrote, "What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death?"

But there's good news: "Thanks be to God—through Jesus Christ our Lord!" Though we struggle each day, each day God forgives us because of Jesus' perfect sacrifice that was complete payment for all our sins. At last, Jesus will come and take us to be with Him in heaven. There will be no sin there, around us, or inside us, to fight against or drag us down.


