A Word of Thanks

God grant that we follow His Word to praise and thank our dear Lord for His precious blood, which He so freely offered for us. And may God keep us from the terrible vice of ingratitude and the forgetfulness of His blessings. (What Luther Says, p. 1354)

Are you having trouble coming up with a list of reasons to offer your thanks to God as you see the Thanksgiving holiday rapidly approaching? It is very easy for us to take things for granted. It can be very difficult for us to be truly thankful. Complaints about what we have or what we do not have flow easily from our lips. Since we are still trapped in our sinful flesh and we are surrounded by a society with an entitlement mentality, we may fall into the temptation of simply expecting the regular and daily blessings we have grown accustomed to enjoy in this life to just keep coming.

But who's to say that everything we have today will remain in our possession tomorrow?

The Lord may allow natural disasters, illness, fire, identity theft or some other devastation to rip from our hands, homes, bank accounts, and lives what we are tempted to greedily call "MINE!" Then what? Will we grumble against God, or respond in faith like Job, saying, "The LORD gave and the LORD has taken away, may the name of the LORD be praised" (Job 1:21)? Will we finally remember that "the earth is the LORD's and everything in it" (Psalm 24:1)? What will it take to remind us that the LORD is the one who opens His hand to "satisfy the desires of every living thing" (Psalm 145:16)? How can we be reminded that we are recipients of God's blessings and merely caretakers or stewards of what rightfully belongs to Him?

We dare not approach the Almighty with a "You owe me" mentality, unless we truly want Him to pay us what our sins deserve. Our discontent, ingratitude, thanklessness, greed and many other sins earn God's eternal wrath and punishment.

For us there would quite literally be "hell to pay" if Jesus hadn't paid our debt to His righteous Father, and if the Holy Spirit hadn't brought us to faith in Jesus through the Word and Baptism. Which is why we rejoice that the blood of our precious Lord was freely offered for us on the altar called Calvary. Right there in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ for us sinners is where our thanks begins. In Jesus' wounds we find healing for our sin-wounded souls. In His dying and rising we find forgiveness and the certainty of eternal life in heaven. Could there be any greater reason to give thanks? I should say not!

So we write our "thank you notes" to the Lord in our joyful and confident faith, trusting in His promises and care. And our thank you is displayed in our daily meditation in His Word. We express our thanks with humble service and willing obedience to our God. Our gratitude is shown in hearts that are content with His blessings and generous in our offerings. We show our appreciation to the Lord when we remember that He is the source of every good and perfect gift.

So beginning with the gift of our Savior, His Word and our Christian faith, we reflect on the many heavenly and earthly blessings our Lord graciously and generously pours into our lives. We celebrate this year God's grace in the 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation that His Word and Sacraments continue to be readily accessible to us for the strengthening of our faith and guidance in Christ-like living. Looking over the wealth of blessings He gives to our bodies and souls, and realizing that we do not deserve anything good from our heavenly Father, we can speak to Him a daily word of thanks from the bottom of our hearts (and not only at meal times):

Psalm 95:1-2




Many of us like to sing. Even if we are hesitant to sing publicly, when we are alone in the car or at home, often we sing along when we hear our favorite songs.

We second guess how God deals with us and this world. We don't give God the love he deserves. He comes in second or third or four hundred fortieth on our love list. Our actions and attitude pile up a boatload of trouble for us. God should reject and punish us.



So we sing to the Rock of our salvation. We sing for joy because God has forgiven us. We sing songs about his sure promises to chase away our fears and heal our wounded hearts. We sing to express our love to God who will never stop loving us.

Go ahead and sing to the Rock of our salvation. If you aren't sure what to sing, or would like company singing to the Lord, come and worship with us. We have found real comfort and genuine joy in singing together the praises of our Lord.

Connecting College Students with Churches



WELS Campus Ministry is introducing a new student management system. It is now live for pastors and college students.

With this new system, pastors and churches can now manage student lists online. This includes viewing, sorting, editing, adding, and deleting student profiles as well as managing a student's free subscription to Forward in Christ and Meditations. For college students, the form is available at wels.net/campus-ministry. The new form will enable students to easily manage their campus ministry profiles, including updating addresses, expected graduation date, subscription preferences, and more. Students will need an e-mail address to register and will be given a pin number for their personal log-in. By registering, students will also be able to stay in contact with their campus pastor. Currently, about 460 WELS pastors serve one or more campuses, and nearly 6,000 students are signed up with WELS Campus Ministry. WELS Campus Ministry Chairman Rev. Charlie Vannieuwenhoven says, "The only way for our pastors to know the WELS students who are attending the university they serve is if their name is submitted with WELS Campus Ministry. This information allows the pastor not only to know which WELS students are attending the university he serves, but it gives him the information he needs to make contact with the student to invite them to worship or any other activities and to share with the student what's happening with the campus ministry." WELS Military Services

The WELS Military Services Committee provides spiritual services to WELS members and others who serve in the United States Armed Forces, including those in the National Guard and the Reserves.

The committee carries out its mission through a ministryby-mail program, a full-time civilian chaplain in Europe, and a national civilian chaplain and liaison to the military. As WELS' national civilian chaplain and liaison to the military, Pastor Paul Ziemer maintains regular contact with many WELS troops and their families. He coordinates training conferences for WELS military contact pastors and orients and mentors new military contact pastors. When military clearance and funding permit, he supervises periodic chaplain trips to the Middle East or other areas of hostility.

One hundred twenty-two WELS pastors who live near military installations in the continental U.S. and select nations overseas stand ready to serve our military personnel and their families as part-time WELS civilian chaplains.

We send free copies of Meditations, a printed monthly worship service, and taped audio and/or video worship services to military personnel and civilians on our mailing list.




