# **A Little Spur**

What comes to mind when you hear the word "spur"? Maybe you think of that awful bone growth that you had surgically removed. Train buffs may think of a short line off a railroad's mainline – often referred to as a spur. Cowboys and Christians may be reminded of a little device that is used to get an animal – or a person – moving.

As you read this, we're nearing the end of April or just sneaking into May. The end of the school year is rapidly approaching – just a few more exams. Confirmation class is almost done – just a bit more cramming for a few of you before the examination/confirmation service. Perhaps you've almost finished a big project – just a couple small details left. Maybe you're nearing retirement – just a few more weeks left on the job. Or you might be seeing what appear to be the last few days of your earthly life – just a short while until the Lord calls you home. The end is in sight, and we could all use a little motivation to stay focused.

Our lives are full of tiny, little goals and great, big goals; milestones along the path of this earthly life. But no goal is as great as the Day – that final day on earth – when we will see Jesus and faith will become sight!

Maybe you need a little extra kick-in-the-pants motivation to stay focused on the most important things in life. As we see various chapters in our lives coming to a close, it is important for our Christian faith and our daily service in God's family that we never stop spending time in the Scriptures. It would be easy to say, "School's over, confirmation class is done (or "I'm confirmed!"), Sunday School is finished...I'm going to take a vacation this summer!" Rest is good for the mind and body, but I pray that we don't give up attending church or meditating on God's Word during the summer months. If we fail to take rest for our souls, we can grow weak in our faith. When we let down our guard, the devil – that roaring, prowling lion - sees us as easy prey. If we let our connection to Jesus and His Word get a little dusty, it is easier for us to fall into temptation.

On the other hand, when Christians gather together around the Word, many good things happen. We love and are loved. We are inspired to live our faith in Jesus and inspire others to do the same. We are encouraging others and being encouraged to prepare every day for our Savior's return. We are spurring each other and being spurred to actively grow in our faith and live each day to the glory of God.

Listen to the guidance of Hebrews 10:24-25 (EHV): Let us also consider carefully how to spur each other on to love and good works. Let us not neglect meeting together, as some have the habit of doing. Rather, let us encourage each another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

A cowboy wears spurs for a reason – to get a sluggish horse moving. We Christians have each other – to keep (or get) ourselves moving in the Word and in expressing our faith in Jesus through a life of love and service to the Lord and our fellowman.

Continue to take care of your soul this summer. Stay spiritually focused. We need the daily reminder of our Savior from sin and our sure hope of eternal life through Jesus. Take time out of each week for worship and Bible study this summer. Feed your faith and find rest for your soul with fellow Christians in God's house. Together we will continue to spur one another on to Christian love and service, keeping Jesus as our primary focus during these summer months, right up until the Day we are ushered home to heaven.
