Stand with the Word!

"Verbum manet in aeternum": these Latin words are engraved on many church bells. Loosely translated, it means "The Word stands into eternity." It is a fitting sentiment to have on our hearts for a new year.

"The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the Word of our God stands forever."

We don't really know what the new year holds for us, do we? We can have plans for how our lives will go this year, but God alone knows our future. Maybe we will have lots of good things happen to us this year. Or maybe we will wish 2021 never happened. More than likely, the events of our lives over the next twelve months will be somewhere in between these two extremes. No matter what heights our lives reach or what pits we fall into, the Bible is the one constant in our lives. Through it, God makes sure that, "Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain." As we stand with the Word of our God, we will find it balancing out the highs and lows of our lives. The Word lifts us up and brings to us the message of our Savior: your sins are forgiven. When life is going too well, the Word keeps us close to God when we are tempted to drift away from him. When we stand with the Word, our path through life is level and straight.

As time marches onward, we know our lives will be different a year from now-how different only God knows. Chances are, someone from our congregation will be in heaven with Jesus by New Year's Day 2022. Perhaps you will receive the gift of a new child or grandchild to love and cherish. Maybe you will face a health challenge or get good news from the doctor about something with which you are already struggling. But we do know for certain: life will change in some way for all of us in 2021.

If something bad does happen to you in the next year, you know where to turn for support. The devil can attack us fiercely. Our sins can try to swallow us. The sinful side of us will try with all its might to lead us astray from God's Word, instead wanting us to trust in our own hearts for comfort and strength. When these things happen to you, and they will, instead of being blown about by sins or hardships, stand firm with the Word this year.

The Word provides for all of your spiritual needs. When it seems like everyone in the world is against you, remember the picture the psalms paint of our response. "You, Lord, prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil, my cup overflows. Be still and know that I am God." If sin troubles you, know that in the cross of Christ, your sins have been removed from you as far as the east is from the west. When death comes for you or someone you love, hold fast to the promises you have from God about eternal life. "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me will live, even though they die, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die." If or when things go wrong in your life, remember where to run for comfort and the strength to persevere in the face of hardship. "Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem (the church), and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins."

Go boldly into 2021! Make time each day for quality time alone with the Word. Set aside time each week to make sure you can worship regularly either in-person as you're able or online. Whatever challenges or blessings will come into your life this year, you already know how to handle them. Stand with the Word as the center of your life, and no trial will be too big to sweep you away in sorrow. You know your Savior and the depths of his love for you. You know the work of the Holy Spirit on your heart.

Each time you hear church bells ringing, remember these words: *The Word stands into eternity*.

Katie knew that gazillion was going to be tough to beat, but thinking hard she finally proclaimed: "Oh yeah? Well, you are ... to infinity!" His jaw dropped because Joey knew his sister had him beat. How could he compete with *infinity*?

Simply put, infinity means stretching on and on, without any end. When something is infinite it has no boundaries. It is unlimited and immeasurably great.

The Bible helps us understand the concept as it describes God. "Who can hide in secret places so that I cannot see them?' declares the LORD. 'Do not I fill heaven and earth?' declares the LORD" (Jeremiah 23:24).

There is only One who is everywhere, who always has been, who always will be, who had no beginning, and who will have no end. That is God.

God wants us to feel good about him being infinite.

As we begin a new year, it can be great to know that God is always with us. Wherever the year takes us, God will be there too. The comfort of God's unending presence is ours through faith in his Son, Jesus. As the Apostle Paul says: "In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence" (Ephesians 3:12).

God knows everything we think, everything we do, and most importantly, he knows everything we need. In fact, God already took care of our greatest need. He sent his infinite Son to be our Savior! Trust him.

Why Do We Celebrate Christmas on December 25?

Q: Why do we celebrate Jesus' birthday on Christmas? It seems like the "church" put it on that day which shares pagan worship of false gods. Jesus did not come to start His own religion but to teach and follow God's word. I want to follow the real God.

A: We do not know the date of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem. The Bible does not list that date. There are no historical records for that momentous event. Numerous ideas have been proposed for the origin of December 25 as the date of Jesus' birth. Those ideas range from early Christians' belief that Jesus was born on that day to the establishment of a Christian holiday that would counter a heathen festival. The date of Jesus' birth is not known.

What we do know is the reason Jesus became man. Standing before Pontius Pilate, Jesus said, "The reason I was born and came into the world is to testify to the truth." The truth of the Bible is that all people are sinners in need of a Savior, and Jesus is that Savior. Galatians 4:4-5 states: "But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship." We can praise God on December 25 and every day of the year for sending a Savior, his Son.

By believing in the Triune God and Jesus Christ as your Savior, you are following the real God (John 5:24). You can rest assured that your faith is not misplaced (1 Peter 2:6).

Both will be sending Valentine cards to all our shut-ins.




