We will have many opportunities to serve our LORD in 2021. People are the engine of our church. Our members each contribute in their own way and are appreciated for everything they do. Consider joining us for Bible class. It is important that each of us members of Peace take an active part in the church and encourage others as well, so we are all growing in our faith.


