Do the Work of Our Ascended King!

He did not leave us without help.

When Jesus left his first disciples by ascending into heaven, they were a little confused. But Jesus had made his will for his followers of every age crystal clear just before his departure. "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Jesus' work of saving the world from sin, death and the devil was completed by his Easter resurrection. Jesus still had work to do, but it was not work to be done by him visibly on earth. Jesus worked with his followers, "until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen." At this point the disciples had been thoroughly instructed by Jesus. It was time for them to go with the Word to the world.

Without seeing Jesus here with us, we can easily become discouraged and listless in doing the work he asks of us. The kingdom of God has many enemies, and they seem to be growing in both number and strength. How can we keep up the work Jesus wants us to do of sharing him with such a world? Centuries after the ascension, Jesus still isn't back yet. We are still waiting to see him keep his last promise to us. How does that make you feel? Are you impatient because you cannot wait to leave this world that seems to grow more sinful and corrupt with each passing day for the unending joy of heaven? Are you afraid of Jesus' return because you do not know when it will be or what it will be like? Or do you wonder if your life has been more sinful than sanctified? We can so easily be overcome by fear and anxiety as we wait here for Jesus' return.

Thanks to the Holy Spirit, the Word of God remains powerful and effective to advance the kingdom of grace in hearts and minds until the last day of this world. We are equipped by our ascended Savior to do his work. "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." We have that power in our hearts. It is called faith, simple trust in Jesus and his promises. He has kept all of them perfectly for us. Why would he not keep his promise to uphold and strengthen us through the Word and sacraments until he returns in glory? Because of the Holy Spirit, we trust in the forgiveness Jesus won for us on the cross and guaranteed by God the Father in the empty grave of Easter. That changes our hearts impatiently waiting for Jesus. Faith calms our hearts. Now worry and fear over the work Jesus has given us to do flees from us. Jesus has ascended to prepare a place for us in heaven. We keep ourselves busy until then by studying the Word, growing in our godly living and sharing the good news of Jesus with others.

Your ascended Savior brings you the forgiveness you need for the moments you have become so earthly minded that you have forgotten about the goal of getting out of this world to be with him in heaven. Jesus offers you that renewed focus in the remembrance of your baptism. He brings it to you in the Lord's Supper. In his Word, Jesus renews your trust in his forgiveness and the promises he kept completely for you. The Holy Spirit renews your confidence in the completed work of your crucified, risen and ascended King to encourage and equip you for doing his work. God bless your celebration of Ascension Day!


