



What's beneath the cross?

If you've ever wondered about what is under our cross that we put by the altar during Lent and why it's there, here's an explanation.

Bread & Wine: Reminds us of the Last Supper when Jesus instituted Holy Communion

Rose: The flower of love; reminds us of God's love for Jesus and His love for each of us

Two pieces of cloth: Reminds us of Jesus' inner and outer garments

Crown of thorns: Reminds us of the crown of thorns that was placed mockingly on Jesus

Purple robe: Reminds us of the robe the soldiers mockingly put on Jesus; reminds us also that Jesus IS the King of kings.

Tassel on the outer robe: Meant to represent noble descent; the outer robe is also a prayer shawl—Jesus was Jewish and would have followed all the Jewish customs such as wearing a prayer shawl.

Coins: We are reminded of the blood money that Judas received—and tried to return— for betraying Jesus. When the high priests refused to take the money back, Judas threw it down and left them. The high priests then used that money to purchase a graveyard.

Sign on cross: Pilot had a sign made and hung above Jesus' head on the cross that said "Jesus King of the Jews".

Jar & sponge: Jesus cried out from the cross: "I am thirsty." These items remind us of this part of the passion lesson.
